THE SIMPLE PAST – Type 1 Verbs eg γράφω

To form the simple past 1) form the simple past stem and 2) add the simple past ending

For all verbs, endings in the simple past are:

- $-\alpha$
- -85
- 3-
- -αμε
- -ατε
- -ανε

These are simply added to the second stem which is formed from the present stem as follows:

- -φ often changes to -ψ eg γράφω (I write) becomes έγραψα (I wrote)
- -ευ often changes to -εψ eg δουλεύω (I work) becomes δούλεψα (I worked)
- -v often changes to -σ eg κλείνω (I close) becomes έκλεισα (I closed)
- -ζ often changes to -σ eg γυρίζω (I turn) becomes γύρισα (I turned)
- -γ often changes to -ξ eg ανοίγω (I open) becomes άνοιξα (I opened)

NB:

Note the change in stress: In the past, the stress is always on the <u>third</u> syllable from the end and where necessary (to create a 3^{rd} syllable) an initial ϵ - is added eg $\epsilon\gamma\rho\alpha\psi\alpha$, $\epsilon\gamma\rho\alpha\psi\epsilon$, $\epsilon\gamma\rho\alpha\psi\epsilon$ but $\gamma\rho\alpha\psi\alpha\mu\epsilon$

In the third person plural, an alternative form may exist: γράψανε or έγραψαν

For passive verbs (eg κάθομαι) stems are formed differently (see later section) but the same endings apply.

There are also several verbs which form their stems irregularly but again the same endings apply.
